

# Bagley/Macedonia Park History

Macedonia Park was a historically Black, formerly unincorporated residential area in Buckhead

Bagley Park, renamed for William Bagley, a prominent Black refugee from Forsyth County, sustained between 300 and 400 residents at its height

Due to petitioning from Garden Hills Women's Club in the 1940s/1950s, County Commissioners voted to condemn the neighborhood to make a park

Residents of Bagley Park were expelled/displaced, and Bagley Park was a green spaces by the mid-1950s

# Key Assumptions of the Previous

- **WATER & SEWAGE**

The condemnation of Bagley Park was primarily centered on the notion that the area's sewage was endangering surrounding neighborhoods

- **STATE OF DISREPAIR**

Bagley Park was also characterized as unsafe, dillapidated, and in a state of general disrepair

- **LACK OF PARKS/GREEN SPACES**

Both County Commissioners and the GHWC repeatedly emphasized the lack of public green spaces and demand for more

- **BAGLEY PARK FOR CONDEMNATION**

Discussion of Bagley Park explicitly stated the neighborhood would be condemned to turn into green space

# County Expects Full Bagley Park Ownership in Fall

Acquisition of the one-fifth of Bagley Park, Negro slum area in North Fulton County, that has not been bought by the County, may be completed this Fall, four members of the Commission have announced.

Meeting with members of the Garden Hills Civic Club, Commissioners Tom Camp, R. L. Doyal, I. Gloer Hailey and Charlie Brown said they would exert every effort to "find" the \$25,000 needed to complete acquisition of the entire area in September.

In any event, the Commissioners said, the project definitely will be given top priority in the County budget for 1949 if necessary funds do not become available this year.

Members of the Garden Hills Club met to discuss ways to complete the project to "provide a badly needed recreational area for young people in the section" and to "eliminate a breeding place of crime and a cesspool of filth."

tion of the new jail take precedence over the recreation building so that this bad condition may be corrected at once.

### 3. ROADS, BRIDGES, AND CONVICT CAMPS.

The convict camps were found in a clean and sanitary condition, food of good quantity and well prepared. Stonewall Camp roof observed to have several bad leaks. Repairs are recommended.

It is recommended that some regulation uniform be worn by prisoners and to be used at all camps.

It is recommended that the completion of the Ben Hill Camp be sought with minimum of delay.

### 4. PUBLIC WELFARE, HEALTH, OLD AGE PENSIONS AND SANITATION.

The Department of Public Welfare is directly responsible for investigating cases requiring aid and supervising the expenditure of approximately Four Million Dollars within the county. We feel there is an ever-growing need for long range planning in this work, particularly for child welfare and rehabilitation. It is apparent that no adequate or fair appraisal can be made of such an extensive organization by short-life committees of the Grand Jury. It is recommended that some plan of continuation be set in motion whereby Committee members will be available for future consultation, so that successive Juries will be able to build on their predecessor's work looking forward to producing a thor-

ough and where they find unsanitary conditions existing that necessary steps be taken to abolish them.

### 10. PUBLIC PARKS.

Investigation shows the parks to be well maintained and a supervised recreational program operating in city and county systems. This program is being enlarged as rapidly as funds are available. As evidence of the worthiness of this project there has been a decrease in the number of juvenile delinquents, disclosed by the records of the Juvenile Court.

Notwithstanding the above favorable comments, investigation develops that the county has purchased a certain tract of land, known as Bagley Park, between Buckhead and Garden Hills. Investigation develops that the county is now contemplating the purchase of additional property for the completion of this park. It is our opinion that this is not a suitable location for a park and unnecessary, due to the proximity of other well developed parks.

It is further the opinion of this body that the attraction represented by the Botanical Gardens is not sufficient to merit expenditure of public funds to continue this project, unless and until more interest is manifested by the sponsors of this project.

Lack of interest in and failure of the public to use the facilities of West Manor Park causes us to feel that the playground equipment should be moved to a more popular center, and the activities

Notwithstanding the expenditure of millions for roads and bridges over the State since 1941, this project is in an abandoned condition, impassable and represents the wasteful expenditure of public funds.

In order to salvage a part of this cost, it is our recommendation that this project be carried to a state of completion at an immediate date to preserve what is left and avoid further deterioration, otherwise, it will be a total loss to the taxpayers of the state of Georgia and Fulton County. Its completion will relieve congestion on the Roosevelt Highway.

### 18. COMMITTEE REPORTS.

Particular attention is directed to the fact that these Presentments comprise a mere synopsis of the findings of this Body's several investigation committees. The full report of each of these committees is available to any one interested, and are to be found in the files of the Grand Jury records. It is the intention of this Body to supply those individuals to whom we feel these reports would be particular value with mimeographed copies of each report in full.

### 19. COMMENDATIONS.

We commend the police officers and investigators for the efficient manner in which they presented the cases to the Grand Jury.

### 20. COMMENDATION OF SOLICITOR GENERAL.

  - Why did Fulton County prioritize the interests of the Garden Hills Women's Club? Was there a social or financial connection between the two entities?
  - Why would the city buy houses in a condemnation area only to attempt to sell them?
  - For property owners, what was the difference between the assessed and market values of their homes?
  - Can we determine the outcome of Bagley Park residents after their displacement?
